
Create a guidebook for underserved individuals on assessing SNAP benefits.

Equality Now

Equality Now campaigns for legal and systemic change to address violence and discrimination against women and girls around the world. Equality Now works to create, reform, challenge, and apply the law to establish enduring equality for women and girls everywhere.

Pro Mujer

Pro Mujer is a U.S.-based organization that works to advance gender equality in Latin America. Their objective is for women to reach their full potential, improve their living conditions, and become agents of change for their communities. They focus on the areas health and wellbeing, financial inclusion, and skilling opportunity.

Association for Women's Awareness and Rural Development (AWARD)

AWARD is dedicated to community development work without any discrimination of sex, caste, color and religion. They work to create inclusive, just and democratic society capable of engaging women leaders in responsible and accountable governance.

<u>Fundacja Ogólnopolski</u> <u>Strajk Kobiet</u>

Ogólnopolski Strajk Kobiet not only organizes protests for women's rights and democracy in Poland, but they protect protestors from different forms of harassment not least including state harassment. In addition to protesting for reproductive rights, Ogólnopolski Strajk Kobiet provides educational programs about reproductive rights and women's rights at large.

Womankind Worldwide





Save the Children

Save the Children works to give children a healthy start in life, the opportunity to learn and protection from harm. Save the Children works to advocate for the rights of children in 120 countries and lead advocacy efforts during times of crisis that ensure children's needs are a top priority.



Global Infancia

Global Infancia works towards creating a culture which respects the rights of children and adolescents in Paraguay. Global Infancia works to strengthen human rights legislation and civic engagement in Paraguay, with a focus on children and adolescents, in order to effect long-term change. Their work ranges from helping the government to enact laws to protect children, to working with journalists to improve civic engagement on issues which threaten children's rights, to working directly with children and their families in semi-urban areas of Paraguay to improve their lives.



<u>Fundacion A Mano</u> <u>Manaba</u>

Fundacion A Mano Manaba works to advance gender equality in order to improve the lives of the most vulnerable populations—children and women—in northern Manabi through formal and informal education programs. The organization empowers girls and women so that they may explore their full potential, and educates boys and young men so they may be able to challenge the traditional masculinity of a patriarchal society.

Voto Latino

Voto Latino is a grassroots political organization focused on educating and empowering a new generation of Latinx voters, as well as creating a more robust and inclusive democracy. Through innovative digital campaigns, culturally relevant programs, and authentic voices, the organization shepherds the Latino community towards full realization of its political power.

Black Votes Matter Capacity Building Institute (BVM)

BVM helps strengthen community-based organizations seeking to expand civic engagement and power-building in marginalized Black communities.

Minority Rights Group International (MRG)

MRG is an international human rights organization that promotes the rights of minorities and cooperation between communities. MRG works in over 60 countries with around 130 partners and campaigns over the world for marginalized ethnic, religious and linguistic minorities and indigenous people.

Survival International

Survival International is a global movement for Indigenous peoples' rights. They work to protect Indigenous land by lobbying and advocating for policies that support Indigenous peoples.

UnidosUS elevates the voices of Latinos and defending and advancing our community's concerns. Today, they remain steadfast in their mission to realize a day where all Latinos thrive and their contributions are fully recognized.



Asian Americans Advancing Justice (AAJC)

Asian Americans Advancing Justice works to advocate for Asian Americans by promoting justice for all Americans, empowering our communities, bringing local and national constituencies together, and ensuring Asian Americans are able to fully participate in our democracy.




Centre for Law and Democracy

The Centre for Law and Democracy works to promote, protect and develop those human rights which serve as the foundation for or underpin democracy, including the rights to freedom of expression, to vote and participate in governance, to access information and to freedom of assembly and association. Their recent work includes projects in Myanmar, Maldives, and an open source information project via partnership with UNESCO.

Gay & Lesbian Alliance Against Defamation (GLAAD)

GLAAD's Global Voices initiative aims to build LGBTQIA+ acceptance across the globe by sharing stories of LGBTQIA+ people and their families around the world. GLAAD supports LGBTQIA+ advocates build capacity for change in their own cities and countries. GLAAD advocates for fair, accurate and equal representation when LGBTQIA+ policies are made at the local and national level.



<u>Pride Foundation</u> Australia

Pride Foundation Australia provides funding for projects that address the systemic disadvantage of LGBTQIA+ communities and individuals in Australia. Pride Foundation Australia has a dedicated focus on advancing equity for the most disadvantaged LGBTQIA+ Australians, including advocating for systemic change and LGBTQIA creative arts



Egale Canada Human Rights Trust

Egale Canada Human Rights Trust works to advance human rights based on sexual orientation and gender identity and expression and to bring out a cultural change through public diplomacy, research, education and community engagement. Their legal advocacy work helps to make explicit that LGBTQIA+ experiences are reflected in policy at all levels of government and beyond.



The International Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Trans and Intersex Association (ILGA)

The ILGA acts as a global voice for the rights of those who face discrimination on the grounds of sexual orientation, gender identity, gender expression and/or sex characteristics. They work towards achieving equality, freedom and justice for lesbian, gay, bisexual, trans and intersex people through advocacy, collaborative actions, and by educating and informing relevant international and regional institutions as well as governments, media and civil society.

American Civil Liberties Union (ACLU)

The ACLU works in the courts, legislatures, and communities to defend and preserve individual rights and liberties. The ACLU works to protect and expand Americans' freedom to vote through strategic litigation and public awareness campaigns. The organization advocates for equality by highlighting injustices that lead to voter suppression, and by challenging discriminatory legislation that hinders people from participating freely in elections.

Rock the Vote

Rock the Vote is a nonpartisan nonprofit dedicated to building the political power of young people. Young voters face unique obstacles that result in turnout historically 20 to 30 points below older voters. This discrepancy is even greater in midterms, state and local elections. Rock the Vote focuses on research-driven programs and innovative solutions to right the system and ensure each youth generation is represented in our democracy.

When We All Vote

When We All Vote is a nonpartisan initiative to change the culture around voting and close the race and age gap in electoral participation. When We All Vote brings together individuals, institutions, brands, and organizations to register new voters across the country and advance civic education to build an informed and engaged electorate.

HeadCount

HeadCount is a nonpartisan organization that uses the power of music to register voters and promote participation in democracy. They reach young people and music fans where they already are—at concerts and online—to inform and empower. HeadCount organizes voter registration drives at more than 1,000 live events each year and collaborates with cultural leaders to promote civic engagement at a national scale.

Brennan Center for Justice

The Brennan Center is an independent law and policy organization that conducts rigorous research to identify problems and provide in-depth analyses of pressing legal and policy issues. Affiliated with New York University, the organization also pioneers and champions policy solutions, such as automatic voter registration and small donor public financing.



United We Dream

United We Dream is led by young American immigrants who are working to improve the lives of their communities. Their vision is a society which celebrates their diversity and they believe in leading a multi-ethnic, intersectional path to get there.



<u>Higher Heights</u> <u>Leadership Fund</u>

Higher Heights Leadership Fund is building a national civic engagement infrastructure and network to strengthen Black women's leadership capacity. Higher Heights Leadership Fund is investing in a long-term strategy to expand and support Black women's leadership pipeline at all levels and strengthen their civic participation beyond just Election Day.



<u>Center for American</u> <u>Progress (CAP)</u>

CAP is a nonpartisan policy institute that is dedicated to improving the lives of all Americans through bold, progressive ideas, as well as strong leadership and concerted action. With policy teams from a number of disciplines and major issue areas, CAP applies creative approaches to develop ideas for policymakers that lead to real change.



EMPLOYEE ACTIONS



- → Check if you're registered to vote. Remember to request an absentee ballot if you'll be away from your polling station. Rock the Vote has plenty of <u>resources</u> to help check your status, get registered, and <u>request an absentee ballot with one step</u>.
- → Learn about civic engagement.
 - Read <u>Civic Influencers</u>' guide to "<u>Why Local Elections Matter</u>," which highlights how voters can make a difference in their local elections.
 - Check out the Everyday Activism Network's guide on "How To Be an Everyday Activist."
- → Turn voting into a social event. Organize a carpool with your coworkers to vote in your local election. You can also host an election night watch party.
- → Keep up with the news. Stay up to date with current affairs, both in your own country and around the world, to make sure you're making educated decisions when voting.
 - Sign up for daily newsletters and podcasts that make it easy to stay in the know. For newsletters, we like <u>Morning Brew</u> and <u>Axios</u>. For podcasts, listen to <u>Up First</u> by NPR or <u>The Daily</u> by The New York Times.








EMPLOYEE RESOURCE GROUP (ERG) ACTIONS

- → Organize an ERG voter registration drive. Your ERG can help all your colleagues check their status, register to vote, and request an absentee ballot. Rock the Vote has resources on how to organize a registration drive here.
- → Text-banking for an important cause. Mobilize—a platform that helps volunteers sign up to join canvassing groups and text banks—can help your ERG find or organize an activity around a cause you care about. See a list of opportunities here.
- → Host a book club. Check out this list of the five best books on human rights from the writer Steve Crawshaw, who has worked on policy for nonprofits including Amnesty International and Freedom from Torture.

 Your ERG can choose one from the list and host a community discussion.
- → Partner with a local civic activism group. Organizations like Amnesty International provides tools, resources, and staff to help you bring together you and your community to champion human rights. A list of their activist groups and resources can be found here.










